We are grateful when corporate and community partners stand united in our mission to eliminate domestic and intimate partner abuse in the Lehigh Valley. This support means that we are able to keep expanding our programs, services, and staff. In September, our Executive Director, Lori Sywensky, was contacted by a longtime community supporter, Lisa Meszler Lyon. She was excited to share a possible grant opportunity with us. Lisa a commercial real estate agent who is currently a top agent with ALT Realty LLC. Soon she will be opening her own firm, Off Market St. Real Estate where she will be owner/partner. In addition, she is also owner/partner of BroMe Construction.

Lisa told us about a potential opportunity to apply for funding through the TJX Foundation and connected us with Steve Cimijotti from the TJX Warehouse in Breinigsville. Steve told us that because of Lisa's input, he recommended us for one of two \$10,000 grant awards. We understood that it was not guaranteed, that it was going to be a four-week competitive vetting process, and no matter the outcome, we were flattered for the recommendation.

In preparing our application and navigating their website, we were thrilled to see that our mission was in alignment with their corporate philanthropy. Preventing domestic violence is one of their four areas of social impact. Their community mission is to "provide value to our communities by helping vulnerable families and children access the resources and opportunities they need to build a better future."

It was refreshing to read on their website that they support survivors of abuse. According to their website, "We believe everyone deserves a safe and secure home free from abuse, which is why TJX supports domestic violence service organizations. We specifically fund programs that provide a safe haven for those fleeing domestic violence along with the tools they need to rebuild their lives as well as related services, like education, training, and job placement resources."

n the application it asked about our SMART goals and how we would achieve them (in 100 words or less). Since we already use SMART goals with clients for goal planning as part of our empowerment model, the answer to that question came easy. The hardest part was to narrow it down into 100 words or less, but we did it.

Fast forward to February 2021 when we received the award notice that we were selected for the grant! Since there were only two grants available, we were honored to be the recipients of \$10,000 from the TJX Foundation awarded on behalf of TJX Asset Recovery and Recycling Center Grants Program to support our domestic and intimate partner abuse services. Congratulations to Third Street Alliance for being the other recipient of the \$10,000 grant!

Many thanks to Lisa, Steve, the TJX Foundation and the TJX Community Relations Department for all your support, trust in our services, and for being our allies. These funds will help us to continue to provide our life-saving services to survivors of domestic and intimate partner abuse and their children in order for them to be safe, secure, and to thrive.



"I've always made it a point to give back and volunteer my time raising money for those in need. Several years ago, I got involved with a group and performed in The Vagina Monologues to raise money for Turning Point. It became a true passion of mine as my children and I are survivors.
