Turning Point has been closely monitoring the guidance provided by state and federal agencies related to COVID-19. Our greatest priority continues to be helping survivors of domestic and intimate partner abuse, and we know this includes implementing the recommended preventive measures to limit the possible spread of the coronavirus and other infectious diseases.

This week we have begun taking increased preventive measures and actions to implement the recommended, "social distancing."

These steps include:

- Offering remote services when possible, especially for those at high risk of infection;
- Temporarily suspending our group activities, including our supportive group counseling services at all locations;
- Postponing our next New Advocate Training session;
- Requesting that all visitors, including those generously wanting to drop off donations; postpone visits if at all possible during this time.

Our hotline will continue to operate with no interruption during this time.

Please note that we have no confirmed or presumptive cases of COVID-19 among our staff or clients. The measures we are taking at this time are meant to help do our part in stopping the spread of the virus.

We place a priority on the health of our survivors, our employees and our partners and will continue to monitor the emergence of COVID-19 and its' impact on our services to determine the appropriate actions.
